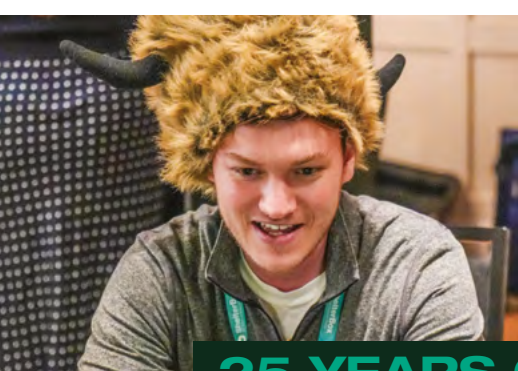

ROTARIANS POWER OUR RESPONSE IN CALIFORNIA

In January 2025, wildfires swept across Los Angeles County with devastating speed, forcing more than 200,000 people to flee their homes. The Palisades and Eaton fires—now among the most destructive in California’s history—claimed at least 29 lives and destroyed more than 18,000 homes and structures. Entire neighborhoods were reduced to ash. Thousands remain displaced.

Among those who lost everything was René Amy, a longtime Rotarian and ShelterBox USA Ambassador.

Thanks to generous supporters like you, ShelterBox USA mobilized quickly—this time in our own backyard.

In partnership with Rotary Districts 5280 and 5300, Amazon Disaster Relief, and local volunteers, we provided essential aid to hundreds of families facing unimaginable loss.

Solar lights, warm thermal blankets, cook sets, personal bags, and air purifiers donated by Intellipure. These items did more than meet basic needs—they offered a path forward.

Remarkably, despite his own loss, René joined ShelterBox staff and Rotary partners at the Pasadena Convention Center to help coordinate the distribution of essential relief items.

“René’s resilience reflects who we are,” explained ShelterBox USA President Kerri Murray. “We show up with aid, compassion and hope.”

In addition, ShelterBox USA matched \$100,000 of donations made to Rotary Districts 5280 and 5300 to support the shelter and household needs of families in the hardest hit areas.

This isn't ShelterBox's first response in the United States, but it is a powerful reminder: Disasters don't just happen far away. They happen here, too. And when they do, ShelterBox is ready.

Zara fled Sudan with her children after witnessing unimaginable violence. “We saw our loved ones killed and fled to take refuge in Chad,” she shared. “It was the only way to survive.”

She’s one of over 123 million people forcibly displaced around the world. When fighting broke out in Sudan in April 2023, millions were uprooted. Zara and her young family walked for three days across scorching terrain to reach the safety of Chad.

“Life was good in Sudan,” she remembers. “There was peace, water, and the children’s lives were good. We had food, we had neighbors — we had everything.”

Now, safety comes with struggle. “We must travel 6 to 12 miles for water. Most women don’t have money for business. The children no longer go to school, and I myself do not work.”

Despite the uncertainty, Zara remains hopeful.

“I advise women like me to have patience and courage for a better future — for themselves and their children. For me, having shelter is a good thing, but what I want most is to live in peace with my children here in Chad, and for there to be peace in Sudan too.”

Refugees like Zara are not economic migrants. They are families forced to flee life-threatening situations. And while many cross borders, 55% remain displaced within their own countries.

Understanding these realities brings us closer to a more compassionate world where everyone has a place to call home.

EARTHQUAKE UPDATE

MYANMAR

On March 28, a powerful 7.7 magnitude earthquake struck Myanmar, followed by a second major quake on April 13. Before the earthquakes, over 3.5 million people in Myanmar were already displaced by conflict.

The need for safe shelter is more urgent than ever as families are now sleeping outside and monsoon rains increase the risk of disease and hardship.

Delivering aid into this traditionally closed-off country is complex. Without your support this work would not be possible. Thanks to pre-existing Rotary connections and trusted local partners, ShelterBox was able to move quickly.

ShelterBox has launched a five-month project to support 1,000 earthquake-affected households with shelter repair assistance.

Thanks to your support, we've begun a five-month project to repair homes in 36 rural villages across Mandalay state and Southern Shan state. With our local partner, we are working to ensure family homes will last longer and can withstand the rainy season.

Your support is helping families in Myanmar take the first steps toward recovery with safe shelter, trusted local leadership, and the dignity of rebuilding stronger homes.

PREPAREDNESS AND PARTNERSHIP

AFGHANISTAN

Two powerful earthquakes struck eastern Afghanistan within days of each other, killing more than 2,000 people. In the hardest hit areas, 98% of buildings are damaged or destroyed. Hundreds of thousands are now homeless, and families are forced to sleep in the open as freezing temperatures set in.

Shelter is essential. ShelterBox is responding with a trusted partner on the ground. Together, we are providing locally sourced shelter, thermal blankets, winter clothing, kitchen sets, buckets and solar lights, as well as considering basic repairs to homes that are still standing.

Access is difficult. Mountain roads are blocked and damaged. Some families walk three hours to reach the nearest health clinic. Coordination is also a challenge as needs shift daily. "With houses completely flattened, the emergency shelter we provide will need to last for months," explained Jonty Ellaby, ShelterBox Emergency Coordinator.

Preparedness is key. ShelterBox had already been planning winter support for remote families returning to Afghanistan after being displaced by conflict. That groundwork meant partners were in the affected provinces within 24 hours. Being ready before disaster strikes allows us to act quickly and help families face the harsh winter with dignity.

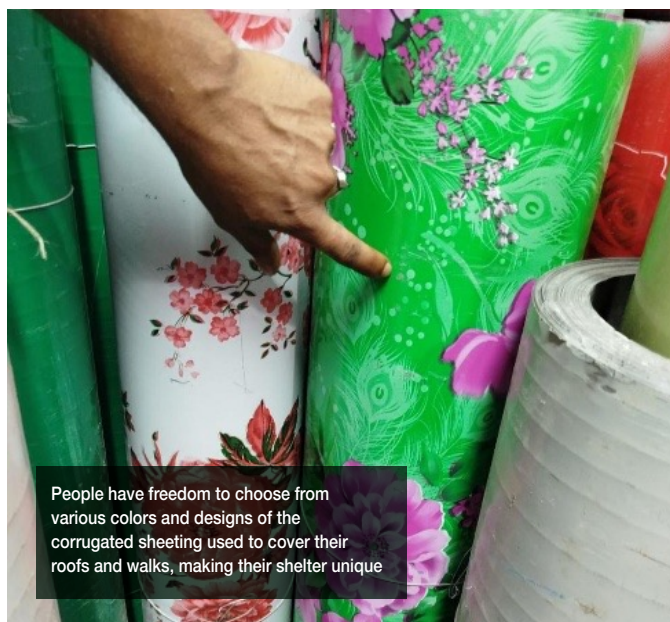
BUILDING BACK BETTER

BANGLADESH

Your support is helping families in eastern Bangladesh rebuild after the devastating floods and mudslides of 2024. More than 500,000 people lost their homes and livelihoods.

ShelterBox is working with our partner Uttaran to help families regain stability. Supporters like you have given people the freedom to choose their own building materials—restoring both dignity and control in the recovery process.

Families are using local resources in creative ways. Some are building with bamboo and wood, while others are choosing new floral-patterned corrugated steel sheets that bring color and individuality to their shelters. These patterns are deeply rooted in the region's culture, helping families feel their houses are not just rebuilt, but truly homes again.



People have freedom to choose from various colors and designs of the corrugated sheeting used to cover their roofs and walls, making their shelter unique



LESSONS FOR LASTING PROTECTION

Training sessions provide skills and knowledge to help communities take greater control of their safety.

Your donations are helping people build new homes raised above the ground and with perimeter walls to keep out floodwaters.



With ShelterBox and our partners, communities are preparing for the future. Through practical workshops, families are learning to build new houses on mud plinths three feet above the ground.

These raised foundations provide long-term protection against extreme weather and keep homes safe from rising floodwaters. Families are also strengthening their defenses by building brick walls around their homes.

Thanks to you, recovery is about more than survival—it's about resilience. Families are not only rebuilding their houses, but also restoring a sense of hope, pride, and long-term security.

Over the past 25 years, ShelterBox has worked in over 100 countries, adapting to fast-changing conditions to ensure people most affected by disasters are not left behind. More than 3 million people have now received ShelterBox aid since our founding. In 2024 alone, your support helped deliver emergency shelter, essential tools, and long-term recovery 270,000 people in 17 countries..

1. YOUR DONATION HELPS US DECIDE OUR RESPONSE

We're always on standby. Every two weeks, a member of our global response team steps in as the "watchkeeper". This watchkeeper is responsible for monitoring global news, weather patterns, humanitarian alerts, and government updates 24/7.

When a disaster strikes, the watchkeeper alerts the wider Emergency Response team who then initiate what is called a 'Go/No Go' meeting.

Together, we evaluate if ShelterBox aid fits the situation and whether it is safe to deploy a team considering the political and security situation in the affected region. Each decision balances urgency with care.

When deployment is approved, a trained response team of staff and volunteers is mobilized within 48–72 hours to work with partners on the ground.

DID YOU KNOW?

We pre-position aid strategically located in warehouses across South America, the Middle East, Asia, and Europe. These stockpiles, combined with local Rotary connections and trusted local partners, allow us to respond faster and more efficiently.

2. YOUR DONATION REACHES COMMUNITIES IN NEED

When our ShelterBox team arrives, they connect with trusted local partners who open access to affected areas and share insight into the community's needs.

Together, we assess the scale of damage and determine the most effective aid — from tarps and toolkits to water filters, lights, mosquito nets, or cash assistance.

We also provide shelter training, equipping community members and partners to build back stronger and safer, and prepared to lead future recovery efforts long after we leave.

Our aid is always shaped by local voices, local climate, and local infrastructure.



3. YOUR DONATION CHANGES LIVES AMID CRISIS

Every disaster is different and so is the right solution.

Sometimes, it's innovation. In Yemen, we deployed iron-net shelters for families displaced by years of conflict — a stronger, more durable option than the makeshift structures they'd relied on.

Sometimes, it's speed and simplicity. After the 2023 earthquake in Morocco, ShelterBox tents and tools helped families in the Atlas Mountains withstand bitter winter winds. We trained residents to secure shelters for maximum safety, helping restore a sense of normalcy.



And sometimes, it's rebuilding stronger. After Cyclone Remal struck Bangladesh in 2024, we partnered with Uttaran to deliver repair kits to 1,400 families — including corrugated iron, timber, rope, and bamboo — so they could strengthen their homes and safeguard their futures.

Thanks to you, ShelterBox delivers more than emergency relief. We help families recover with dignity, privacy, and the foundation for a better tomorrow.

After disaster, shelter is just the start. In many places, families also face economic hardship.

In Somalia, residents began transforming old ShelterBox tarpaulins and plastic waste into something new: woven mats, handbags, baskets, and vases. What started as a way to clean up their environment became an income-generating initiative. With minimal resources, families began producing and selling these handmade items to feed their children and rebuild their livelihoods.

Training and shelter repairs allow families to return home faster and reopen businesses, send kids back to school, or resume farming. Your donation doesn't just respond to crisis — it sparks recovery.

SUPPORTER SPOTLIGHT

Local people do their best to raise funds for ShelterBox



Supporters in motion during the 13th Annual Ride for ShelterBox, where riders pedaled 13, 28, or 52 miles — all to raise funds for families displaced by disaster. The day ended with a celebratory community spaghetti dinner.

Two ShelterBox Ambassadors turned Adventurers, Tom Deuson and Jane Lanford, launched the summer season with powerful feats of endurance — all to raise funds for ShelterBox programs.

In upstate New York, longtime Ambassador and Rotarian Tom Deuson led the 13th Annual Ride for ShelterBox, hosted by the Watertown Rotary Club. More than 100 cyclists took part in the event, pedaling through scenic farmland and lakefront roads.

“The cyclists in the Annual Ride for ShelterBox are the epitome of motivation in motion,” said Kerri Murray, President of ShelterBox USA. “They’re turning their passion into real-world impact for people who’ve lost everything.” The ride reflects the power of community and a small town’s belief that they can make a global difference.

Meanwhile in Alaska, humanitarian and Rotary Club of Fairbanks member Jane Lanford took on a deeply personal challenge: running 70 miles over three days across the rugged Denali Highway to mark her 70th birthday. Supported by her husband in a small camper, Jane ran roughly 23 miles each day — one for every year of her life.

“You can’t help the whole world,” Jane shared, “but you can mean the whole world to somebody.”

Jane has completed marathons in all 50 states, but this run was different: a tribute to displaced families around the world, and a reflection of her enduring compassion. “The little bit of comfort and security I feel in my trailer — it’s kind of the same when you give someone a tent,” she shared. “It’s their little piece of home.”

ShelterBox Response Team volunteer Bruce Heller has spent years delivering emergency shelter to families after disasters. In 2025, he and his three adult sons—Jason, Ryan, and Collin—took on a new challenge closer to home: climbing Mount Kilimanjaro.

The Heller family set out with a bold goal to raise a dollar for every foot of the 19,710-foot mountain. Enduring long days of steep ascent and thin air, they pushed forward together and ultimately reached the summit, raising more than \$39,000 to help families who had lost everything. For Bruce, who has seen firsthand the relief a ShelterBox brings to disaster survivors, the climb carried a special meaning.

“It’s something I’ve wanted to do for a long time,” Bruce shared. “When I realized I could combine it with supporting ShelterBox USA, the decision was easy.”

For the Hellers, this adventure was about more than the climb. It was about uniting as a family to give other families hope.
